IAFFPE to Exhibit at Premier Allergy, Asthma & Immunology Conference

Organization to promote increased understanding of Food Protein-Induced Enterocolitis Syndrome (FPIES)

Roselle, NJ (March 1, 2012) – The International Association for Food Protein Enterocolitis (IAFFPE) will be an exhibitor at the 2012 Annual Meeting of the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma & Immunology (AAAAI) in Orlando, FL from March 2–6. The conference is an exciting opportunity for IAFFPE to raise awareness about Food Protein-Induced Enterocolitis Syndrome (FPIES) and network with more than 7,000 international allergy and immunology physicians.

Jonathan Spergel, MD, PhD and Robert Wood, MD will discuss the pathophysiology and symptoms of FPIES, current diagnostic tests, and oral food challenge procedures.

Visitors to the IAFFPE booth (Booth 727) will be able to access a variety of collateral, including details about FPIES; educational materials geared toward medical professionals, families and caregivers; a literature review of FPIES research; and information about the organization's research, fundraising, advocacy and education initiatives.

Schultz added, "The IAFFPE aims to be that connection between FPIES patients, families and the medical community, and the AAAAI Annual Meeting is the ideal venue to connect with the medical professionals who can improve the lives, health and services for those affected by FPIES."
